

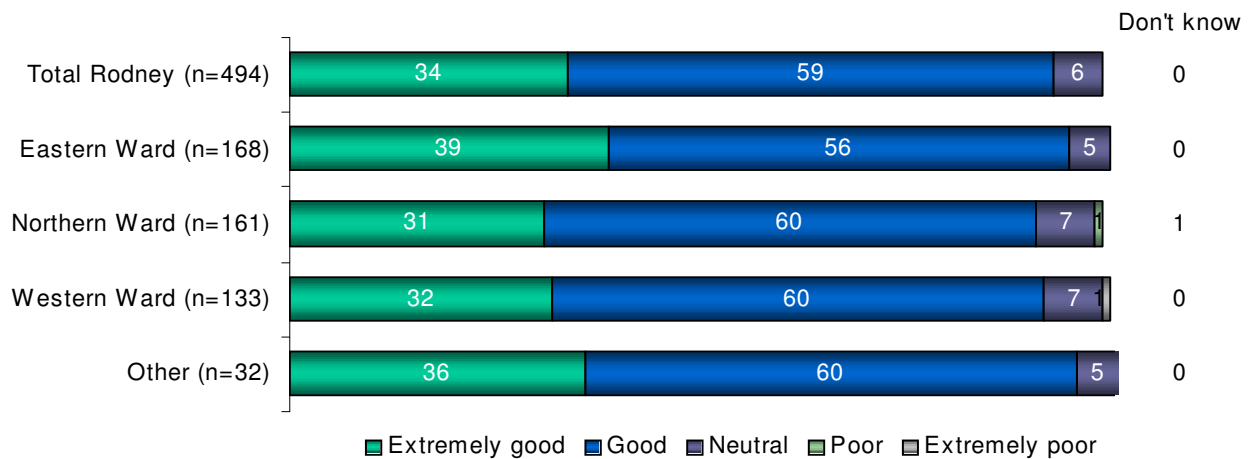
### 3.0 Quality of Life

*This section looks into the overall quality of life of residents within Rodney District.*

The majority (93%) of Rodney District residents felt they had a positive overall quality of life, responding with a rating of either *extremely good* (34%) or *good* (59%).

When comparing Wards, there was little difference in residents' perception of their overall quality of life (between 91% and 95%) (note base size comparison of n=130 or more).

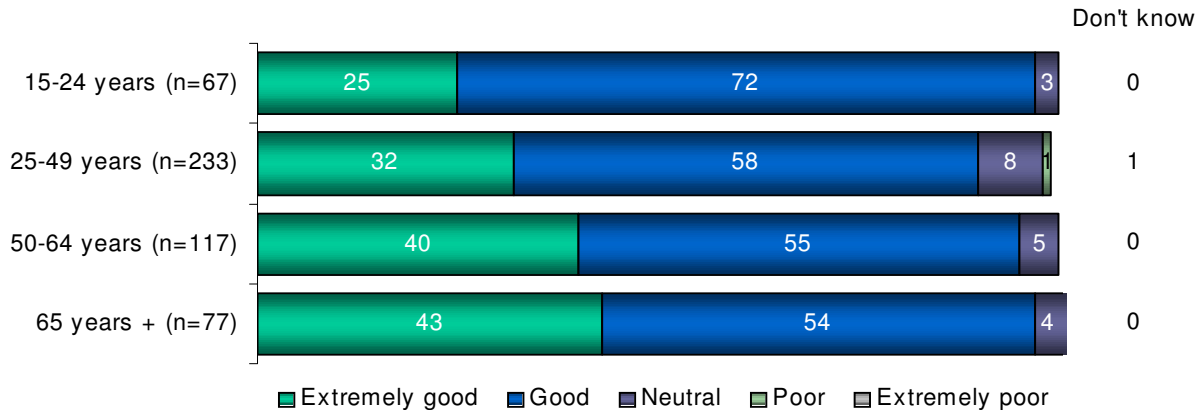
**Figure 3.1: Perceptions of Quality of Life – By Ward (%)**

Residents aged 25-49 years were significantly less likely to rate their overall quality of life positively (90%, either *extremely good* or *good*) compared to other age groups within Rodney District (between 95% and 97%).

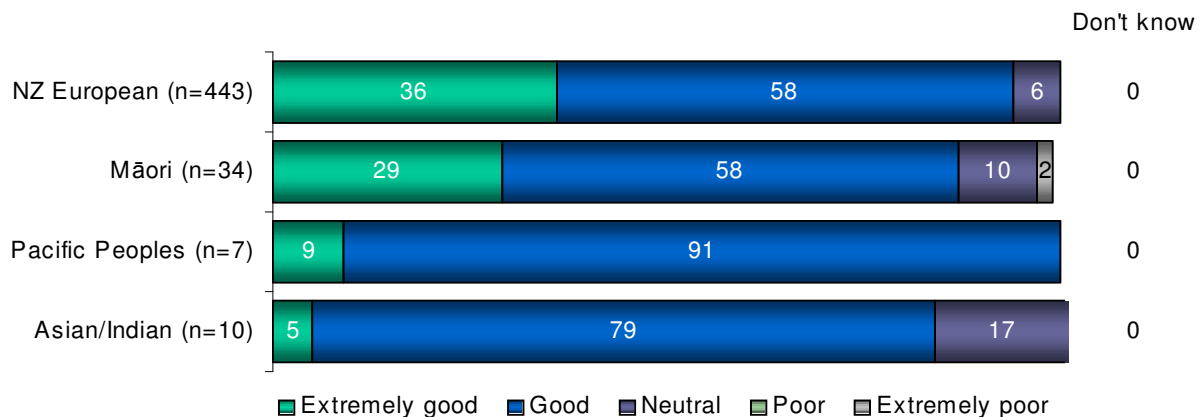
**Figure 3.2: Perceptions of Quality of Life – By Age (%)**

When comparing ethnic groups, the typically small base sizes do not allow for comparison.

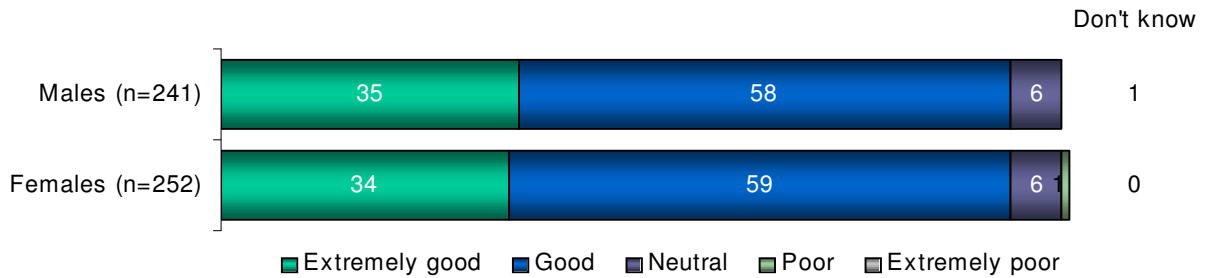
**Figure 3.3: Perceptions of Quality of Life – By Ethnicity (%)**

For both male and female Rodney District residents, the majority (93% and 92% respectively) felt they had a positive overall quality of life (either *extremely good* or *good*).

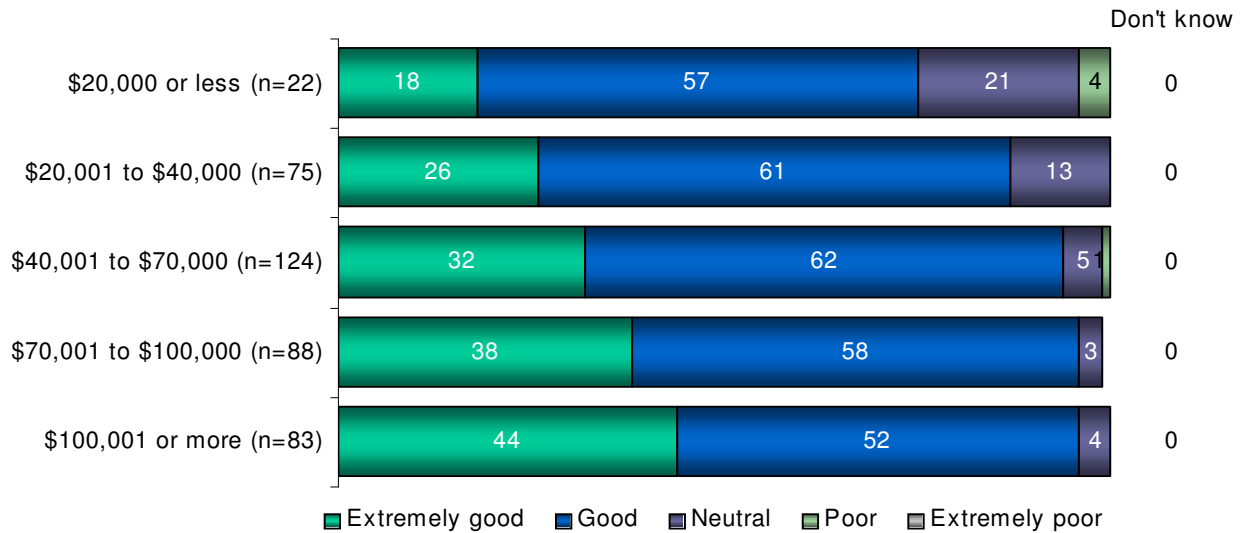
**Figure 3.4: Perceptions of Quality of Life – By Gender (%)**

Residents with a household income between \$70,001 and \$100,000 or over \$100,000 were slightly more likely to rate their overall quality of life positively (97% and 96% respectively, either *extremely good* or *good*) compared to other household income groups within Rodney District. Those with a household income between \$20,001 and \$40,000 were significantly less likely to rate their overall quality of life positively (87%) (note base size comparison of n=70 or more).
