RODNEY DISTRICT COUNCIL GENERAL BYLAW: 1998

CHAPTER 15

DOG CONTROL

EXPLANATION

A Bylaw prepared under Section 20 of the Dog Control Act 1996 to give effect to the Rodney District Dog Policy 2004.

1.0 SHORT TITLE, COMMENCEMENT AND APPLICATION

1.1 This bylaw is the Dog Control Bylaw for Rodney District and comes into force on 1 September 2004.

1.2 This bylaw applies to the Rodney District.

2.0 INTERPRETATION

ACT	Means the Dog Control Act 1996 and Amendments
BEACH	Means any land vested in or under the control of the Council which is higher than and contiguous with: (a) the line of mean low water springs (MLWS); or (b) the water boundary of any lake; and which in each case is for the time being used in connection with the adjoining lake or water below MLWS. (c) For the purposes of the Chapter 15 - Dog Control, means the foreshore area covered and uncovered by the ebb and flow of the tide, and any adjacent area which can reasonably be considered part of the beach environment, including areas of sand, pebbles, shingle, dunes, or coastal vegetation and the beach adjacent to the water boundary of any lake.
COMPANION DOG	Means a dog certified by the Top Dog Companion Trust as being a companion dog or a dog under training as a companion dog.
CONTROL	In addition to the definitions of "not under control" set out in the Dog Control Act 1996, means that the dog is not causing a nuisance or danger and that the person in charge of the dog is able to obtain an immediate and desired response from the dog by use of a leash, voice commands, hand signals, whistles or other effective means.
COUNCIL	Means the Rodney District Council or officer authorised on its behalf.
DISTRICT	Means the area under the control of the Rodney District Council.
DOG OWNER	Means owner as defined in section 2 of the Dog Control Act 1996 and includes every person who: (a) Owns the dog; or (b) Has the dog in his or her possession, whether the dog is at large or in confinement, otherwise than for a period not exceeding 72 hours for the purpose of preventing the dog causing injury, damage, or distress, or for the sole purpose of restoring a lost dog to its owner; or

	<p>(c) The parent or guardian of a person under the age of 16 years who—</p> <p>(i) Is the owner of the dog pursuant to paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) of this definition; and</p> <p>(ii) Is a member of the parent or guardian's household living with and dependent on the parent or guardian;—</p> <p>but does not include any person who has seized or taken custody of the dog under this Act or the Animal Welfare Act 1999 or the National Parks Act 1980 or the Conservation Act 1987 or any order made under this Act or the Animal Welfare Act 1999.</p>
GUIDE DOG	Means a dog certified by the Royal New Zealand Foundation for the Blind as being a guide dog or a dog under training as a guide dog.
HEARING EAR DOG	Means a dog certified by the Hearing Association (Incorporated) as being a hearing ear dog or a dog under training as a hearing ear dog.
ON A LEASH	Means that the dog is kept under control by means of a leash, lead or chain not exceeding 3 metres in length, or a retractable leash of up to 8 metres in length, which is secured or is held by a person competent to ensure that the dog cannot break loose.
PRIVATE WAY	Means a private way as defined in the Local Government Act 1974 and includes any way or passage whatsoever over private land within the District, the right to use which is confined or intended to be confined to certain persons or classes of persons and which is not thrown open to the use of the public generally.
WORKING DOG	<p>Means any working dog as defined in section 2 of the Dog Control Act 1996 and includes:</p> <p>(a) Any guide dog, hearing ear dog, or companion dog:</p> <p>(b) Any dog -</p> <p>(i) Kept by the Police or any constable, the Customs Department, the Ministry of Agriculture, the Ministry of Fisheries or the Ministry of Defence, or any officer or employee of any such Department of State, solely or principally for the purposes of carrying out the functions, powers, and duties of the Police or the Department of State or that constable, officer, or employee; or</p> <p>(ii) Kept solely or principally for the purposes of herding or driving stock; or</p> <p>(iii) Kept by the Department of Conservation or any officer or employee of that department solely or principally for the purposes of carrying out the functions, duties, and powers of that Department; or</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (iv) Kept solely or principally for the purposes of destroying pests or pest agents under any pest management strategy under the Biosecurity Act 1993; or (v) Kept by the Department of Corrections or any officer or employee of that Department solely or principally for the purposes of carrying out the functions, duties, and powers of that Department; or (vi) Kept by the Aviation Security Service established under section 72B(2)(ca) of the Civil Aviation Act 1990, or any officer or employee of that Service solely or principally for the purposes of carrying out the functions, duties, and powers of that Service; or (vii) Certified for use by the Director of Civil Defence Emergency Management for the purposes of carrying out the functions, duties, and powers conferred by the Civil Defence Emergency Management Act 2002; or (viii) Owned by a security guard as defined in section 4 of the Private Investigators and Security Guards Act 1974 and kept solely or principally for the purposes of carrying on the business of a security guard; or (ix) Declared by resolution of the territorial authority to be a working dog for the purposes of this Act, or any dog of a class so declared by the authority, being a dog owned by any class of persons specified in the resolution and kept solely or principally for the purposes specified in the resolution.
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3.0 CONTROL OF DOGS IN PUBLIC PLACES

Prohibited Areas

- 3.1 Every dog owner must ensure that his or her dog does not enter or remain in any public place designated as a prohibited area in the First Schedule, and more precisely defined on maps to be seen at Council Offices.

Note: *Protected Wildlife Areas specified by the Department of Conservation as "Controlled Dog Areas" under the Conservation Act 1987, Section 267zs are listed in Schedule Five.*

Leashed Areas

- 3.2 Every dog owner must ensure that his or her dog is kept on a leash in any public place or private way designated as a leashed area in the Second Schedule.

Note: *All areas specified by the Department of Conservation as "Dog Open Areas" under the Conservation Act 1987, Section 26zs are listed in Schedule Six.*

Off Leash Areas

- 3.3 Every dog owner may exercise his or her dog off a leash, but must keep the dog under control, in any area designated as an off leash area in the Third Schedule.

Designated Dog Exercise Areas

- 3.4 (a) Every dog owner may exercise his or her dog off a leash, but must keep the dog under control, in any area designated as a dog exercise area in the Fourth Schedule, and more precisely defined on maps to be seen at Council Offices.
- (b) Notwithstanding 3.4(a) above, any dog classified as Dangerous under Section 31, or Menacing under Section 33A of the Dog Control Act 1996, shall be controlled on a leash not more than two metres long which is securely held by a person competent to ensure that the dog cannot break loose.

Exemptions

- 3.5 Clauses 3.1 and 3.2 do not apply to the owner of:
- (a) A working dog while it is working; which includes a dog used for hunting or retrieving game; or
- (b) Any dog which is confined completely in or on a vehicle or in a cage; with the exception of Tawharanui Regional Park, where dogs are completely banned from entry to the Park or
- (c) Any dog taking part in a special event approved by the Council, such as a dog show or dog training seminar.
- (d) Any dog being transported through a prohibited dog area provided it is physically controlled on a leash

4.0 REMOVAL OF FAECES

- 4.1 Where any dog defecates in a public place or on land or premises other than that occupied by the owner, the dog owner must remove the faeces immediately and dispose of them in a litter bin provided or in a proper way that does not cause a nuisance.

5.0 SALE OF YOUNG DOGS

- 5.1 Any pet shop or registered dog breeder selling a dog under the age of three months, shall keep a record of the type of dog and the name and address of the person purchasing that dog and on request shall provide the information collected to the Council.

6.0 Housing

- 6.1 Every dog owner must provide his or her dog with suitable housing or kennelling which;
- (a) is weatherproof, dry, clean and gives the dog adequate space, warmth and shade; and
- (b) is situated in a position that does not cause a nuisance to any person.

7.0 LIMITATION ON NUMBER OF DOGS

- 7.1 No person may keep more than two (2) dogs over the age of three months on any land or premises as listed in the District Plan, within an urban residential zone or activity area (including any special zone apart from the Special 8 (Weiti Forest Park) Zone), and Countryside Living (Town) Activity Area, for more than 14 days, unless written permission has been granted by the Council to allow for the keeping of more than two dogs.
- 7.2 In granting a permit to keep more than two dogs on land or premises, the Council shall have regard to the views of persons living in the vicinity who may be affected and may place conditions on the permit and the holder must comply with them. If the holder fails to comply with the conditions, the Council may cancel the permit.

8.0 NEUTERING OF DOGS

- 8.1 Where any dog owner fails to keep his or her dog under control on a number of occasions the Council may, by written notice, require the owner to cause the dog to be neutered.
- 8.2 The dog owner must, within one month of receipt of the notice, produce to the Council a certificate issued by a registered veterinary surgeon certifying:
- (a) that the dog is or has been neutered; or
 - (b) that for reasons that are specified in the certificate, the dog will not be in a fit condition to be neutered before a date specified in the certificate.

If a certificate under (b) is produced, the dog owner must, within one month after the date specified in the certificate, produce a further certificate to the Council under (a).

9.0 OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

- 9.1 Every person who fails to comply with the requirements of this bylaw commits an offence and is liable to a fine not exceeding \$20,000 or an infringement fee not exceeding \$500.
- 9.2 The Council may apply to the District Court under section 162 of the Local Government Act 2002 for an injunction restraining a person from committing a breach of this bylaw.

SCHEDULES

These Schedules are also part of the Rodney District Dog Policy 2004.

The Council may identify changes to Schedules One to Four using the public consultation process as provided for in Section 10 of the Act.

Section 10 of the Act requires the Council to identify public places where dogs may be prohibited; or may be allowed, but under physical control. Under section 10(3)(d) it shall also identify any area or part of the District in which dogs are not prohibited or required to be under physical control. The Council shall also identify areas where dogs may be exercised at large off a leash.

Section 10 (5) of the Act requires the Council to identify in its Dog Policy :

- (i) Controlled Dog Areas or Open Dog Areas under section 26zs of the Conservation Act 1987; or
- (ii) National Parks constituted under the National Parks Act 1980.

The following Schedules set out the public places identified by the Council in this way under Section 10.

The table below summarises the status of dogs in various public places listed in the following Schedules.

FIRST SCHEDULE

(Dog Policy Section 2 and Dog Control Bylaw)

Prohibited Areas

Every dog owner must ensure that his or her dog does not enter or remain in the following public places:

- 1(a) Within 10 metres of any children's playground outdoor court, skateboard park, or sports field, excluding spectator areas, in any public place.

Any person with a dog may pass along any walkway within 10 metres of an area in 1(a) provided that the dog is controlled on a leash.

- 1(b) Any cemetery, crematorium or public building, including any library, swimming pool, recreation centre, and visitor centre, under the control or management of the Council or the Auckland Regional Council, unless permitted by the occupier or person having control of the premises and subject to compliance with any reasonable conditions imposed.

- 1(c) In any of the following places at all times and as defined in maps to be seen at the Council offices:

1. Tawharanui Regional Park and adjoining beaches, including Rodney District Council reserve land adjacent to the entrance;
2.
 - i. Mahurangi Regional Park, Te Muri Bay South of the Te Muri Estuary including the beach adjoining the Park;
 - ii. Sullivans Bay, including the adjoining beach;
 - iii. Mahurangi Regional Park, Cudlip Point from July to November inclusive (lambing season);
 - iv. Scotts Point Regional Park and adjoining beaches, between 9am to 7pm during the hours of daylight saving;
 - v. Scandrett Regional Park, including the beach adjoining the Park;
 - vi. Shakespear Regional Park, except for the land area between Army Bay and northern edge of the planted area at Okoromai Bay.
 - vii. Wenderholm Regional Park and adjoining beaches except for the grassed areas adjoining the entrance road when not stocked, and the cleared land adjacent to the Waiwera estuary.
3. Martins Bay Holiday Park;
4. Orewa Beach Holiday Park;
5. Weiti Estuary Chenier Spits;
6. Parakai Reserve Motor Camp;
7. Maori Bay (Muriwai), headland to headland;
8. O'Neill Bay (Muriwai), headland to headland;
9. Whangateau Holiday Park;
10. All public campgrounds or designated public picnic areas in Rodney District including any regional park.

- 1(d) Any habitat advised by any organisation recognised by the Council, Auckland Regional Council, or Department of Conservation, to be home to protected wildlife species.

2. Prohibited at specified times:

For other than Prohibited Places set out in 1(c) of this Schedule, and any Designated Dog Exercise Area in Schedule 4, any beach listed below:

Definition of Beach:

The beach is the foreshore area covered and uncovered by the ebb and flow of the tide, and any adjacent area which can reasonably be considered part of the beach environment including areas of sand, pebbles, shingle, dunes or coastal vegetation.

SECOND SCHEDULE

(Dog Policy Section 2 and Dog Control Bylaw)

Leashed Areas

Every dog owner must keep his or her dog on a leash in the following places:

- (a) On any road whether or not under the control of the Council (including footpaths or berms), public carparks;
- (b) Every Town Centre as defined in the District Plan, and listed below:

Te Hana, Wellsford, Leigh, Matakana, Warkworth, Snells Beach, Sandspit, Puhoi, Waiwera, Orewa, Gulf Harbour, Whangaparaoa Town Centre, Manly, Red Beach, Silverdale, Dairy Flat, Waitoki, Riverhead, Kumeu, Huapai, Helensville, Parakai, Kaukapakapa;
- (c) Within 10 metres of any shop;
- (d) On any public wharf, boat ramp, or boat marshalling area;
- (e) On any bush walk not already included as a DOC Controlled or Open Dog Area;
- (f) On Kawau and other Gulf Islands where there may be a threat to any native fauna;
- (g) On Muriwai, Rangitira, Okura Marine Reserve, Hamatana, Karaka Point and Ti Point DOC Marginal Strips, where there may be a threat to any native fauna;
- (h) On spectator areas of marked sports fields;
- (i) On the Harry James Reserve at Taupaki;
- (j) On walkways and accessways (whether public or private).
- (k)
 - a) Rat Island, off Shelly Beach, South Kaipara Head
 - b) Foreshore of Lakes Kuwakatai, Kainganga, Kareta and Poutoa, South Kaipara Head
 - c) Foreshore of Lake Tomorata.

THIRD SCHEDULE

(Dog Policy Section 2 and Dog Control Bylaw)

Off Leash Areas

Every dog owner may exercise his or her dog off a leash, but must keep the dog under control in any area not specifically identified in the First and Second Schedules.

FOURTH SCHEDULE

(Dog Policy Section 2 and Dog Control Bylaw)

Designated Dog Exercise Areas

The criteria for determining a suitable dog exercise area are that:

- It is well located in relation to the distribution of population in the District;
- It is easily identifiable to dog owners and the public in general;
- It is accessible;
- It is safe to use by dogs, dog owners and the general public;
- It is suitable for the intended purpose;
- It is well signposted and has suitable facilities (plastic bag containers and bins.)
- It is situated so that the proximity of unleashed dogs is not a threat to protected wildlife.

In the following public places:

- Every dog owner may exercise his or her dog off a leash, but must keep the dog under control.
- Any dog classified as Dangerous under Section 31, or Menacing under Sections 33A and 33C of the Dog Control Act 1996, is allowed in these areas but shall be controlled on a leash not more than two metres long which is securely held by a person competent to ensure that the dog cannot break loose.

NB: Maps defining these areas may be seen at Council offices.

1. Eyres Point, Te Arai: the disused quarry area, excluding the wetlands.
2. Matheson Bay: overflow car park.
3. Matheson Bay from the Meiklejohn Memorial headland and between MHWS (Mean High Water Springs) and MLWS (Mean Low Water Springs) in an unnamed bay north east of Matheson Bay, to the point of the next northern headland.
4. Granville Reserve, off Workers Road, Wellsford.
5. Part of Centennial Park, Wellsford: section of Park defined by Part Section 40 Block XVI, SD Otamatea (SO 40691), and Part Section 40 Block XVI, SD Otamatea (CT 1676).
6. Big Omaha Wharf Road, Whangateau: the full length of Big Omaha Wharf Road and the foreshore at low tide.
7. Point Wells: from the western end of the recreational reserve off Harbour View Road to the recreational reserve off Waimanu Place, to MLWS.
8. Omaha: part of the esplanade reserve on the north-western side of the causeway to MLWS.
9. Snells Beach: the undeveloped western portion of Goodall Reserve with access from Hamatana Road.
10. Warkworth Showgrounds: fenced paddock immediately north of Rodeo site for a distance of 100 metres. Access via entrance to Showgrounds off State Highway 1.
11. Part of Lucy Moore Park, Warkworth: section of Park defined by Lot 131 DP 80666.
12. Hatfield Beach Reserve: part of the reserve west of the public toilets.
13. Victor Eaves Park: area bounded by Westhoe Road in the west, running in an easterly direction for 100 metres and bounded in the south by residential properties on the southern boundary of the park, and in the north by the road running through the park.

14. Western Reserve, Orewa: part of the south-western portion of Western Reserve bounded by the Orewa River estuary.
15. Amorino Park, Orewa: part of the recreational reserve adjacent to the Orewa River, access from Hibiscus Coast Highway.
16. Reserve between Vipond Road and Waiora Street, Stanmore Bay: western part of reserve from access on D'oyly Drive proceeding in a south easterly direction for 100 metres.
17. Cedar Reserve, Stanmore Bay: the south-western portion of Cedar reserve off Cedar Terrace.
18. Garraway Green Reserve, Manly: all reserve.
19. Manly Park, Manly: section of Manly Park on western side of road through park.
20. Sundown Reserve Little Manly: all reserve.
21. Tiri Reserve: all reserve.
22. Fisherman's Rock Reserve: all reserve.
23. Stillwater Reserve: part of the Stillwater recreation reserve off Duck Creek Road.
24. Helensville River Reserve: all reserve.
25. Glasgow Park, Waimauku, excluding the dressage arena, Playcentre and Kindergarten area.
26. Huapai Domain: part of reserve not used for recreational purposes at the western boundary of the reserve, running between State Highway 16 in a northerly direction for 100 metres.
27. Muriwai Beach: the beach between MHWS and MLWS from a point 450 metres north from Motutara Road for a distance of approximately 10 km to the beginning of the Muriwai Beach Marginal Strip and adjacent Crown foreshore, see DOC Sixth Schedule.
28. Selected parts of Woodhill Forest with the consent of Carter Holt Harvey.
